

BRAHMA CODE OF CONDUCT

It is recognized that Diamond Bar High School students who participate in athletics, student government and performing arts are in the public eye and are highly visible representatives of this high school. It is vital that their representation accurately communicates the standards and values that the school promotes. Consequently, athletes, student body officers, and students who perform in the public eye are expected to ensure that their behavior does not discredit themselves, their family, their team or organization or their school. This behavior includes (but is not limited to) any involvement with alcohol, tobacco, drugs, narcotics, marijuana, or “look-alike” substances, or weapons.

All students are expected and required to have exemplary behavior and refrain from any involvement with alcohol, drugs, “look-alike” substances, tobacco or weapons while on school grounds or attending any school event. Furthermore, violations of these expectations at any time of the year, including vacations will result in disciplinary action in accordance with school policy. Because of their role as school representatives, disciplinary action with athletes, student body officers, and students who perform in the public eye often have deeper implications regarding their eligibility to continue in their role as a school representative.

Athletes, student body officers, and students who perform in the public eye who violate this code of conduct will be suspended from their team, office, or organization for a period of **THREE SCHOOL WEEKS** and **FORFEIT ANY LETTER or AWARD**. Their eligibility to participate in their team, office or organization will be restored at the end of three school weeks but it must be understood that a three week absence from that activity will cause adjustments to be made by their organization; therefore, this restoration of eligibility to participate does not necessarily ensure their place on the team, in competitions or within their organization.

There must be a clear understanding that the above consequences for violation of the Brahma Code will be the **MINIMUM** consequences and that additional penalties may be levied by individual organizations because the infraction violates a portion of their charter or code. Codes and charters (constitutions) of specific organizations shall be seen as supplemental to the Brahma Code of Conduct.

It is hoped that with student acceptance and adherence to the Brahma Code of Conduct that Diamond Bar High School will be a school that we can all be proud of and one that is always represented in the most professional fashion possible.
